Chancellor Rosenstone,

It has now been six months since the faculty at Inver Hills Community College voted no confidence in President Tim Wynes. Since that January day, we have not received a single response from you or anyone in the system office concerning the management crisis at Inver Hills Community College.

In a survey commissioned by President Wynes, almost 90% of the faculty and staff believe that President Wynes is not qualified to lead the college. In these past six months the exodus of quality staff from the College has increased. This spring, Inver Hills MAPE and AFSCME members voted overwhelmingly to support the faculty in our effort to improve the campus climate and demand leadership changes. Inver Hills faculty and staff are united in our concerns about the college heading in the wrong direction.

President Wynes has repeatedly told faculty that he does not work for the faculty, the staff, or the students: he only works for one person, and that is you Chancellor Rosenstone. We again ask you, or the Board of Trustees, to act and address the very serious issues facing Inver Hills Community College and President Wynes' poor leadership.
